

*Calystegia longipes*  
(syn. *Convolvulus linearilobus*)

**False Paiute Bindweed,  
Longstalk Bindweed**

- Family: Convolvuleceae  
Genus: Calystegia  
Species: Longipes  
Height: Grows in a mound 1' to 2' high.  
Blooms: May to October.  
Elevation: 3,500' to 5,500'  
Habitat: Piñon-juniper, serviceberry, manzanita, and other warm desert shrub communities.  
Flowers: White to cream, often with lavender veins and fading lavender. Corolla is up to 1½" long. Small spurs at the tips of the five united petals, similar to *Datura wrightii*.  
Leaves: Linear lanceolate, narrow blades with projecting narrow lobes at the base (see lower right photo).  
Range: Arizona (Mazatzal and Hualpai Mountains in Mohave, Yavapai, and Gila counties) to southern Utah, Nevada, and California.  
Notes: Photos taken in Humboldt Mountain area in May 2004.
