




Music in the time of the Psalms was loud and full of rhythm. Castanets (taken from a word which means chestnuts) were two chestnuts attached to the fingers of a person who beat them together to produce music. Drums were wooden hoops with animal skins tightly stretched across the frame. Small hand drums were called timbrels.
