



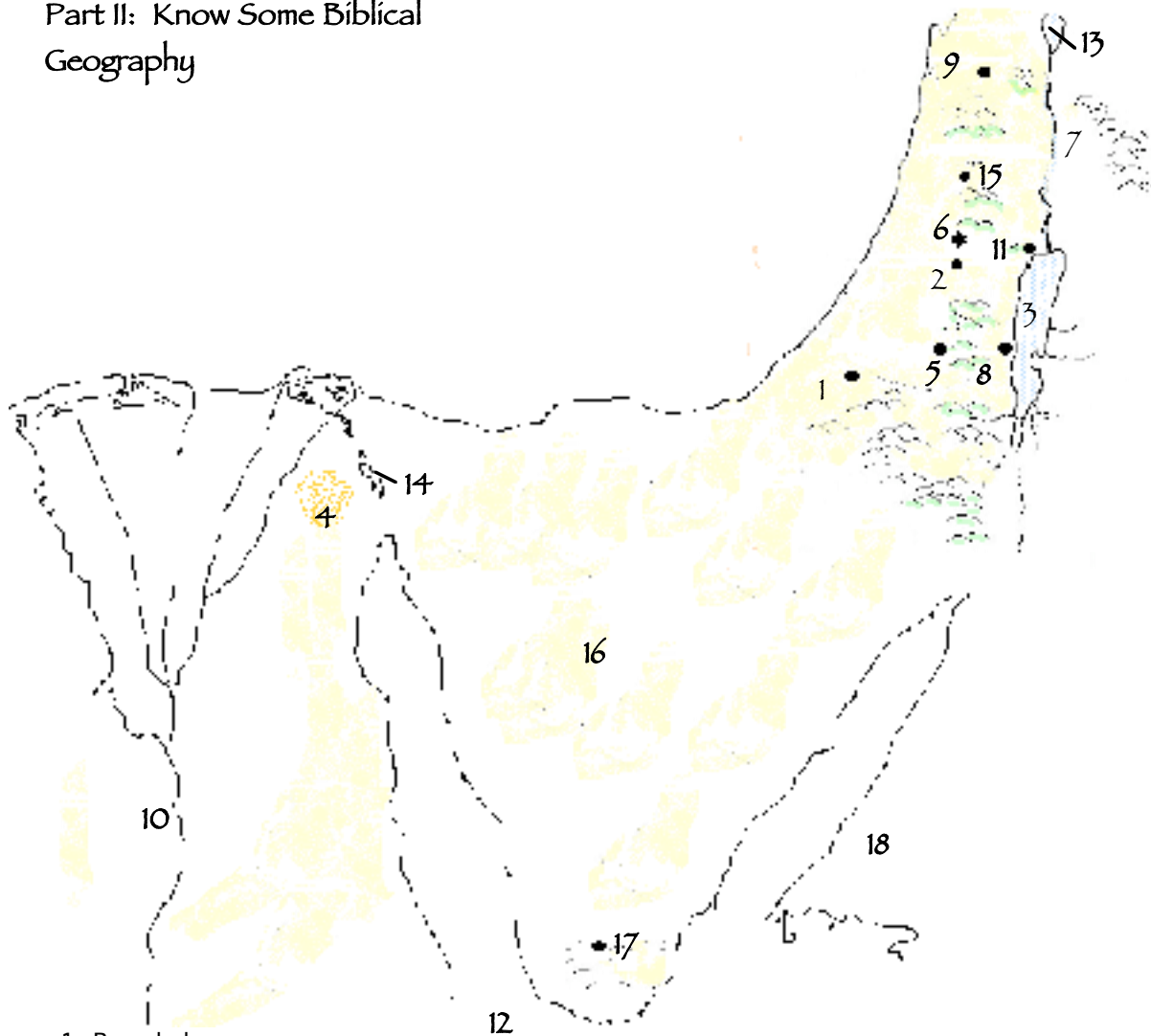

9. When something accomplishes what it signifies. Baptism is "efficacious" in that it not only signifies the removal of Original Sin, but also accomplishes that. It makes one Christian. Circumcision does not make one Jewish.

11. "From the Chair" (of St. Peter) Pope must speak "Ex Cathedra" in order for a statement to be considered infallible. (One of four conditions of infallibility)

16. Refers to a person who is incapable of making any mistakes. Note: Catholics DO NOT believe the Pope is impeccable.

Part IV: Scripture Passages to Know (Know what they say, why they are important and where to find them in the Bible.

1. **Hear Oh Israel, the lord our God, the Lord is ONE**
2. **For God so loved the world that he gave his only son that whoever believes in him might not perish, but have eternal life.**
3. **Brothers, stand firm and hold fast to the traditions you received from us, either by oral statement or letter of ours.**
4. **So, God made man in his image and likeness, male and female he made them in His own image.**
5. **You are “Rock” (Peter) and on this “Rock” I will build my church and the gates of Hell will not prevail against it.** (Jesus makes Peter the rock of the Church and promises that his Church founded on Peter will endure even the “gates of hell.” This scripture is one of the basis for the belief in Papal Infallibility. If the rock foundation of the Church fails, the church as Jesus established it fails and Jesus is proven to be a liar. Thus, Catholics believe that Peter and his successors are guarded from leading the Church into errors, NOT because they are automatically good men, but because of the promise of Christ to us.
6. **God formed man out of the clay of the earth and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life...** This image reinforces Gen 1:27, showing that the human being carries within the divine “spark” which is eternal.
7. **A certain wisdom is needed here; the number of the beast is 666.** This cryptic passage is a great example of how useful and important it is to know the context of a passage (it’s historical and cultural background). Knowing the language of John (Hebrew) the history of Christians in the Roman world AND the custom of associating names with number found in ancient graffiti. 666 = Caesar Nero.
8. **And God said to Moses, tell the Israelites, “I AM” sent me to you.**
